Reading Comprehension.

Are there any words you need your grown up to explain?

Can you retell the story? Ask your grown up to record you retelling the story and listen to your recording together?

Use the attached story sequence pictures to help you.

Can you help prepare a fruit salad?

What will you use?

How will you make it?

Can you write or draw the recipe?



Writing.

Can you make your own hungry caterpillar book? Use the word mat attached to help you.

Make a list of your favourite foods. Do you like the same foods as the hungry caterpillar?

Phonics.

Continue with your daily online RWI phonics sessions and games. Please see attached.

Can you make a list of rhyming words? How many words can you get on your list?

You can even use alien words (i.e. not real words as long as they rhyme!)

Maths.

Warm up! Practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.

Draw a caterpillar. How long is it? Can you measure it using a piece of wool or a pencil? Is it longer or shorter than the wool/pencil? Keep drawing and measuring!

Draw a butterfly with the pattern exactly the same on each side.

Find out more about caterpillars.

Where do they like to live?

What do they really eat?

How many different types of butterflies are there?

Make a cucumber caterpillar.



Use an old sock to make a caterpillar puppet. Put on a puppet show!
