


**Reception.**

**Reading Comprehension.**

If you have the book, share the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' or listen to the story on You Tube.

Why was Jack's mum angry?

What did she do with the beans?

How do you know the beans were magic?

Did Jack do the right thing in taking the hen?

Can you retell the story? How do you think the giant would sound?

**Writing.**

If you were to climb up a beanstalk, what do you think you would see?

Draw a beanstalk and label it with everything at the top. Use the attached word mat to help you.

**Phonics.**

Continue with your daily online RWI phonics sessions and games. Please see attached.

Read the questions attached and answer them with 'yes' or 'no'.

## Maths.

**Warm up!** Play the beans game. Ask your grown up to call out one of the following;

- String **beans** – stretch up as high as you can. Count for 10 seconds.
- Broad **beans** – make yourself as wide as you can. Count for 10 seconds.
- Runner **beans** – run on the spot. How many seconds can you do this for?
- Jumping **beans** – jump on the spot. How many seconds can you do this for?
- Jelly **beans** – shake your whole body like jelly. Count for 10 seconds.
- Baked **beans** – wipe your brow and say, 'Phew!'

Draw a beanstalk with numbered leaves. Can you put the numbers in order?

How tall will your beanstalk be?




Do some measuring using footsteps.

How far is it from the kitchen to the bathroom in footsteps?

Is it different if you use giant sized footsteps?

Draw a castle using different shapes. What shapes have you used? Can you describe the shapes?

Watch the beans growing on You Tube.


Can you save a fruit pip, e.g. from an apple and plant it? How long do you think it will take to grow?
